**.2. GENERAL BUSINESS**

- a. Fire District Public Training Information

David Hargis from the Hudson Fire Protection District was present. The District has started a new position within the fire department and it is public education officer. He will be presenting fire safety programs in the schools. The fire department wants to be present at the town events to promote fire safety.

- b. Event Planning

- Lose Big – Matt Hirschinger, Town Manager Assistant, said the web site program created by Committee Member Campbell has been approved to use. Committee Member Campbell will publish the stie and be ready by Friday Matt will put the link and all information needed for the site on the Town’s web site.

Chairman Chavez will contact the yoga teacher about dates and times for the yoga classes. Prizes will be given to the tree tom winners.

- Easter Egg Hunt: March 27<sup>th</sup> – Most of the items needed for the Easter Egg Hunt have been purchased. Target gave the town a \$50.00 donation for the hunt.
- Animal Clinic: April 24<sup>th</sup> – Matt confirmed the date and prices with Living Springs Veterinary Care, Bennett, CO. The clinic will be from 8:00a.m. to noon.
- Community Garden: Before Mother's Day (May 8<sup>th</sup>) – The event will start at 1:00p.m. It will be to let people know about the garden spaces that are available and how to get water. We will also have program for the kids to make a gift for their mothers. We will be having pots and seeds to plant, paints to use to paint the pots and or paint a picture.
- Fishing Derby: May 22<sup>nd</sup> – We need to get the prizes for the winners, and we need to find volunteers to help.
- Memorial Day BBQ: May 31<sup>st</sup>. – The date is May 31 from 4:00 p.m., to 6:00 p.m.
- Bike Rodeo: - Sergeant Dave Lawley with the police department will be leading this event. The date for the event is June 26, 2021. Sergeant Lawley asked if we could look into getting donations for safety vests and bike helmets. Chairman Chavez stated that she has two bikes donated already and she would contact a bike company about donation helmets. It was also suggested that we look into bike reflectors.
- Outdoor Movie Nights: June 19, July 17<sup>th</sup>, and August 21<sup>st</sup>. – The dates have been secured with Airbound. Matt stated the Town Council will have to approve the contract with Airbound. It was decided that the movies will be held outside the town hall. Matt was asked to get a list of the movies available for either kids or family type movies. After Matt gets the list, we will review it and select the ones we want to show.

#### c Park and Van Update

The Town is working on the next steps for Memorial Park. They will have 3 -6 good questions to present to the Committee and invited representatives to weigh in on the direction of the park.

Hunter Forbare, Public Works Director, has looked into vehicles in connection with the van. He gave us designs to look at. The design was for a normal; 15 passenger van with the ADA wheelchair. It does push the seats down to 11 seats (7 if the wheelchair area is being utilized). Anything larger would require the driver to have a CDL.

It was decided to move forward on this project and approve the vehicle (Ford Transit 350) or one like it. Matt will contact Hunter Forbare about moving forward on this project and Andy William (BNSF) about the grant.

Matt informed the Committee that the Council is looking into the water supply for the future of the town. They are looking for citizen input.

The Town has received that state grant for Broadband and now they need to contact the builders.




