2) GENERAL BUSINESS

- a. **PUBLIC HEARING RESOLUTION 21-22: A RESOLUTION ENACTING A SUPPLEMENTAL BUDGET AND APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2020 BUDGET OF THE TOWN OF HUDSON**

Mayor Pro-Tem Chavez opened the public hearing at 6:11pm.

Guy Patterson, Town Manager, reported that per the last years discussions there were three funds that were going to go over during the fiscal year 2020. Fund 70 due to the booster pump and the water project. Fund 60 was because of the police vehicle purchase, and we had no use tax revenue from the building permits. Fund 10 and that was due largely to work towards 24/7 police coverage. Right now, the Town has 10 million in the bank and the fund balances are healthy.

Mayor Pro-Tem Chavez closed the public hearing at 6:19 pm.

Councilmember Stadler made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Hammock to approve Resolution No. 21-22: a resolution enacting a supplemental budget and appropriation for the 2020 budget of the Town of Hudson.

b. RESOLUTION NO. 21-23: A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BY AND BETWEEN DOUGLAS COUNTY, COLORADO, AND THE TOWN FOR THE TOWN'S USE OF THE EMERGENCY VEHICLE OPERATIONS COURSE

Jay Hirokawa, Police Chief, reported that the track they are using will provide all the equipment to save the Town money and he is no longer authorizing pit maneuvers. They have changed their pursuit policies and this training will help with the new policies.

Councilmember Stadler made a motion, seconded by Councilmember Hammock to approve Resolution No 21-23: a resolution approving the intergovernmental agreement by and between Douglas County, Colorado, and the Town for the Town's use of the emergency vehicle operations course.

Charity Campfield, Town Clerk, reported that the Town has received a request for annexation from Weld County for a section of Land located on Weld County Road 49.

3) STAFF REPORTS

Guy Patterson, Town Manager, reported that he issued the RFP for Allo. He reported that he found a place that sells buses, and they have some for sale so he will be making a trip to Sedalia to look at them.

Hunter Fobare, Public Works and Utilities Director, reported that water pump station is moving forward and he wants to make the switch over and it should perform fine.

Jay Hirokawa, Police Chief, reported that the 52 project is opening up and the complaint level is going down. He reported that they will be staffed here soon. The only thing they do not have equipment wise is uniforms for the new officers.

Daniel Warren, Councilmember, asked about the Hudson Hills sign and if the HOA can put flowers around it.

Joe Hammock, Councilmember, asked why Council was not informed about the investigation into the officer involved shooting in Keenesburg and if some sort of policy can be made about communication to council.

Maria Chavez, Mayor Pro-Tem, reported Farm & Home Lumber will be having their open house on July 16th from 5-8 pm.
