

I-76/SH 52 Interchange in Hudson

The Interstate 76 and State Highway 52 interchange is located in the Town of Hudson in Weld County. While I-76 carries traffic between Denver and the Eastern Plains, SH 76 carries traffic between the towns of Fort Lupton and Hudson. In developing the Upper Front Range Transportation Plan in 2015, CDOT identified this project as the number one priority in Larimer, Morgan and Weld counties.

Project Purpose

The purpose of this project is to identify, evaluate and rank the deficiencies in the interchange, develop design solutions to address these deficiencies and construct interchange improvements based on available funding. As the Town of Hudson grows and commercial freight traffic through this interchange continues to increase, the goal of this project is to provide a corridor that safely moves vehicles, pedestrians and trucks efficiently and harmoniously.



Project Scope

The project limits are between milepoints 31 and 32 along I-76, and along SH 52 from just west of County Road 12 1/2 to the BNSF railroad crossing in Hudson. Final design work is ongoing, with improvements including roundabouts at the Love's and westbound ramps intersections, a traffic signal at the eastbound ramps, and the addition of sidewalk along the north side of SH 52 to increase pedestrian and bicycle connectivity.

Schedule and Costs

This project has a total design and construction budget of \$14.5 million.
