

An Ordinance Declaring That the Maintenance of a Water Tank by the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company on Main Street in the town of Hudson, Constitutes an Encroachment on said Street and a Nuisance and Providing for the removal of the Same.

Whereas, Main Street is the principal travelled street of the town of Hudson, and is a section of the Omaha, Lincoln and Denver Road, and is very extensively travelled, and

Whereas, the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company has been maintaining a water tank in said street near the place where its railroad tracks cross said street, and,

Whereas, said water tank constitutes an encroachment upon said street, constitutes an obstruction in said street, and constitutes a nuisance, rendering travel upon said street dangerous and unsafe.

Now, Therefore, Be It Ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Hudson:

Section 1. That Main street, as mapped out and designated on the official plat of the town of Hudson, is the principally travelled street in said town, and is the only street where a crossing is maintained across the tracks of the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company, and is extensively used by persons and vehicles in going from one part of said town to the other, and by persons and vehicles passing through said town; that said street is a section of the Omaha, Lincoln and Denver automobile road.

Section 2. That heretofore the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company has been maintaining a water tank within said street located near the place where its railroad tracks cross said street.

Section 3. That said water tank constitutes an encroachment on said street, constitutes an obstruction of said street and is a nuisance rendering the use of said street by pedestrians and persons using vehicles dangerous and unsafe.

Section 4. That the clerk of the town is hereby directed within ten days after the date that this ordinance becomes effective, to serve upon the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad by delivery to the agent of said company at Hudson, Colorado, a certified copy of this ordinance, together with a notice in the name of the town, signed by the mayor of the town with the corporate seal of the town thereto affixed, attested by the town clerk of the town, notifying and requiring the said Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad to remove said tank from said street within thirty days after the service of said certified copy of said ordinance and said notice, and further notifying said Railroad Company that if said tank is not removed within thirty days from the service of said notice, that the town through its proper officials will remove said tank from said street.

Section 5. That the mayor of the town of Hudson is hereby authorized and directed to remove said water tank from Main street in the town of Hudson, provided said tank is not removed by the Chicago, Burlington & Quincy Railroad Company within thirty days after the service of the certified copy of this ordinance and notice to remove the same as provided in Section 4 hereof, and that said mayor is further directed, instructed and authorized to employ such persons and purchase such material as may be necessary or proper for the removal of said tank as herein provided.

Section 6. The board of trustees hereby declare that this ordinance is necessary to the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety for the reason that the maintenance of said water tank in said street is dangerous to the lives and property of persons using said street, and that, therefore, this ordinance shall be in full force and affect five days after its publication.

Section 7. That all ordinances of the town of Hudson inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Passed and Adopted by the affirmative vote of more than three-fourths of all the members elected to the Board of Trustees of the town of Hudson, this 3rd day of August, A. D., 1920.
