

An Ordinance concerning privies, Toilets, Urinals, Sinks and Drains.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Hudson:

Section 1. On or after the effective date of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to use or maintain within the Town of Hudson, any privy which fails to comply with the following regulations, to-wit:

a. Any privy shall be a sanitary earth pit privy, with concrete footers and slabs and equipped with screened vents. The riser shall be constructed of concrete or impervious treated wood. The seat and lid shall be hinged.

b. No privy shall be constructed nearer than 50 feet from any well or other source of water supply.

Section 2. On and after the effective date of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to use or maintain, within the Town of Hudson, any private sewer, septic tank or cess pool from which sewage shall be discharged in such a manner that it shall flow or be exposed upon the surface of the ground.

Section 3. On and after the effective date of this ordinance it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to use or maintain any sink, drain, urinal or toilet which discharges any waste material on the surface of the ground.

Section 4. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation using water from the water works of the Town of Hudson, to connect with said water system any hopper type or frost proof toilet.

Section 5. On and after the effective date of this ordinance, no person, firm or corporation shall construct any privy, septic tank, cess pool or other type of sewage disposal facilities without re-

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Section 2. On and after the effective date of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to use or maintain, within the Town of Hudson, any private sewer, septic tank or cess pool from which sewage shall be discharged in such a manner that it shall flow or be exposed upon the surface of the ground.

Section 3. On and after the effective date of this ordinance for any person, firm or corporation to use or maintain any sink, drain, urinal or toilet which discharges any waste material on the surface of the ground.

Section 4. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation using water from the water works of the Town of Hudson, to connect with said water system any hopper type or frost proof toilet.

Section 5. On and after the effective date of this ordinance, no person, firm or corporation shall construct any privy, septic tank, cess pool or other type of sewage disposal facilities without re-

ceiving a permit therefor from the Town Clerk.

Section 6. The violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance is hereby declared to be a nuisance and a menace to public health.

Section 7. This ordinance shall become effective on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ A. D. 195\_\_\_\_\_.

Section 8. Each days failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall constitute a separate offense and any person or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than five (\$5.00) dollars nor more than three hundred (\$300.00) dollars and shall pay the costs of prosecution.

### ORDINANCE NO. 46

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Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Hudson:

Section 1. On or after the effective date of this ordinance, it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to use or maintain within the Town of Hudson, any privy which fails to comply with the following regulations: Any privy shall be a sanitary earth pit privy, with concrete slabs and pipe, and shall be located at least ten feet from any building. It shall be the duty of the owner of such privy to keep it in good repair and to clean it out at least once each year. It shall be the duty of the owner of such privy to see that no garbage, refuse or other objectionable matter is thrown into or about the privy.
